On January 4, 2021, representatives from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) conducted a Compliance Evaluation Inspection at the West Water Reclamation Facility (WRF). During the inspection, the Department found several deficiencies. To resolve these matters, the City of Winter Springs and the FDEP entered into Consent Order No. 21-1055 executed on December 20, 2021. The Consent Order requires the City to compete several activities.

The general contractor is working on reliability improvements at the facility. Based on supply chain and labor challenges adversely affecting the current schedule, it is anticipated that all repairs indicated in permit revision FLA011067-026 will not be completed by July 31, 2022. An extension to this date is requested for an additional six (6) months to December 31, 2022. Work is proceeding on the facility. (Paragraph 7).

Good afternoon David,

The West WRF reliability improvements have been delayed due to pipe material and labor challenges. Pipe material delivery for the improvements was originally anticipated to take 2 months and was delayed for 4 months. Because of the delay in pipe materials, final disk filter installation was completed 5 months after the improvements were ordered. Material delays carried over to labor challenges as well, because materials were delayed construction crews were subsequently assigned to other job sites and had to be recalled once materials arrived on site. In order to maintain forward progress, General Contractor (SGS) has had to subcontract portions of the welding and structural work. Balancing manpower has further exacerbated the issue as crews would have to demobilize from their primary work site and remobilize when materials arrived.

Currently, the temporary frac tank connection is delayed until the week of June 13th due to additional material delays. Final completion of all reliability improvements is not anticipated until the week of the end of June. Following completion, and prior to acceptance of the reliability improvement work, 3-5 days of operational testing will be needed to evaluate all aspects of the reliability improvements. Once reliability improvements are substantially complete, and operations are confirmed, an additional 6 weeks will be required to drain, clean, and evaluate the remaining basin before construction crews can enter the tank and begin repairs. The extent of repairs required cannot be determined until the tank is dry and clean. Once the tank has been evaluated by our structural engineer we anticipate no less than 8 weeks will be required to develop shop drawings, procure necessary materials and complete the structural repairs to the remaining basin.

I appreciate your consideration of this request. It is our intention to move forward and complete all repairs as expeditiously as practicable to provide the resilience and reliability necessary to continue safe and complaint operations.
